OUR VISION is that every family has the furniture they need.







MAKING A HOUSE A HOME

The Furniture Bank's Making A House A Home program fills a simple, basic need - the need for essential household furniture. Before coming to the Furniture Bank, clients are living without furniture, sleeping and eating on the floor.

Each client receives 14+ pieces of furniture on average, depending on the number of people in their household. The gift of furniture improves the financial, physical, and emotional health of clients, increasing the chance of longterm stability for themselves and their families.



ROUTES TO RE-ENTRY

In 2024, the Furniture Bank re-launched its updated employment program with a new name: Routes to Re-Entry. Originally focused on serving homeless veterans, the program now serves returning citizens — people who are transitioning back to society after time in jail or prison.

During the ten-week program, participants receive paid on-the-job training working as interns in the Furniture Bank's warehouse or on its delivery trucks. Interns also receive transportation assistance, resume-building help, financial literacy courses, and more.

At the end of the program, the Furniture Bank pays for trainees to earn their Forklift Operators Certification (4-week training and certification on 5 different lift types). The Furniture Bank also assists graduates with resume building and helps them find a job once they obtain their certification.

The Furniture Bank's 11th annual Race for Rest 5K held on October 19, 2024, raised \$43,108!










